

As he lies on a hospital bed, it falls to DCI Peter Pascoe to seek justice for Andy. The security services have written it off as an accident, as the terrorist suspects have paid for their clumsiness with their lives. Was there involvement by the Knights Templar, a shadowy group exacting summary public justice on their enemies? Pascoe is certain a conspiracy exists and the attempted murder of Yorkshire police's most inept officer only convinces him further.
