FARR YACHT DESIGN'S VIRBAC-PAPREC VICTORIOUS IN 2005 TRANSAT **JACOUES VABRE**

In a dogfight race to the finish, Jean-Pierre Dick and Löick Peyron aboard VIRBAC-PAPREC crossed the finish line at 23:19:02 GMT on Friday, November 18th and claimed first place in the IMOCA Open 60 Class of the 2005 Transat Jacques Vabre.

At the start of the race on November 5th, VIRBAC-PAPREC left Le Havre, France and pushed her way west to the head of the pack. In winds ranging from 25-40 knots, Jean-Pierre Dick and Löick Peyron sailed VIRBAC-PAPREC the 4,600 miles to Bahia, Salvador in a record breaking 13 days, 9 hours, 19 minutes and 2 seconds. The incredible duo with their racing machine shaved 3 days and 4 hours off the former record set by Roland Jourdain and Gael Le Cleac'h in 2001.

This is the second consecutive victory for VIRBAC-PAPREC in the Transat Jacques Vabre. Shortly after her launch, Jean-Pierre and Nicolas Abiven finished in 17 days, 15 hours, 18 minutes and 05 seconds to win the 2003 event.

VIRBAC-PAPREC is a state-of-the-art Open 60 designed by Farr Yacht Design and built by Cookson Boats in New Zealand.

The success of VIRBAC-PAPREC since her launch in 2003 is the major reason Farr Yacht Design has received three new Open 60 commissions, including one from Jean-Pierre Dick and one from Vincent Riou, winner of the 2004 Vendee Globe.
